### **“Australian Data Centres” selected for Federal Government Data Centre Panel**

Australian Data Centres’ Tier III Data Centre in Mitchell, ACT has been selected for the fit-out category of the Whole of Government Panel for the Provision of Data Centres to Australian Government Agencies.

ADC managing director, Rob Kelly, described the business as an Australian owned and operated company committed to delivering superior data centre facilities and services to its clients on a carrier neutral basis.

“Our management has extensive experience in designing and operating superior facilities and will deliver superior capacity and capability to the market in accordance with its theme of “Cleaner. Greener. Safer,” he said. “The Mitchell facility will include the latest international environmental standards, such as the US EPA’s Gold Star rating for Data Centres fully integrated in the design”

ADC’s Mitchell facility is already under development and is located in the lowest risk areas for a data centre in the ACT. The data centre will be of flexible design and initially offer 3,000m<sup>2</sup> of the highly sought after Tier III technical space as part of a potential data centre campus comprising up to 9,000m<sup>2</sup>. Special features of ADC’s offering include environmental design principles which will be incorporated during the construction phase and which are absent in most existing facilities.

This state of the art data centre will offer the most sustainable mechanical and electrical infrastructure and environmental engineering harnessing the latest developments in photovoltaic panels, water harvesting and free cooling

According to Megan James, ADC’s Commercial Director the Technical design is recognised by international data centre experts Arup.

“ADC is proud and excited to be selected to participate in the whole of government panel of data centre providers. It is a great opportunity to assist government agencies with their data centre challenges with carefully-considered, critical infrastructure that is sustainable,” she said.

The panel will be in place for five years. Agencies selecting data centre facilities from the panel will enter into 10-year leases for the use of data centre space, with an option to extend the lease for five years.
